



MacBook Pro 13" Retina Display Early 2015

Lower Case Replacement

Replace the Lower Case on your MacBook Pro 13" Retina Display Early 2015.

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INTRODUCTION

This serves as the starting point for every guide—you'll need a P5 Pentalobe screwdriver to remove the lower case and get into the device.

Step 1 — Lower Case



- Remove the following ten screws securing the lower case to the upper case:
 - Two 2.3 mm P5 Pentalobe screws
 - Eight 3.0 mm P5 Pentalobe screws
- ☑ Throughout this repair, [keep track of each screw](#) and make sure it goes back exactly where it came from to avoid damaging your device.



Step 2



- Wedge your fingers between the upper case and the lower case.
- Gently pull the lower case away from the upper case to remove it.

Step 3



-  The lower case is connected to the upper case with two plastic clips near its center.
-  During reassembly, gently push down the center of the lower case to reattach the two plastic clips.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
