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INTRODUCTION

Microsoft has launched a new version of its official Xbox One Wireless Controller. It has a 3.5mm stereo headset jack, which will allow most third-party gaming headsets to directly connect to the controller for the first time.

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Step 1 — XBOX One Wireless Controller



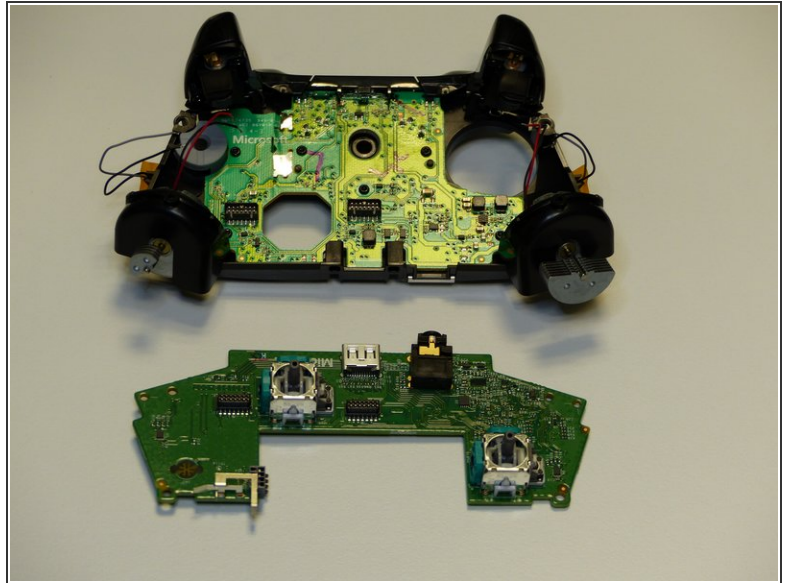
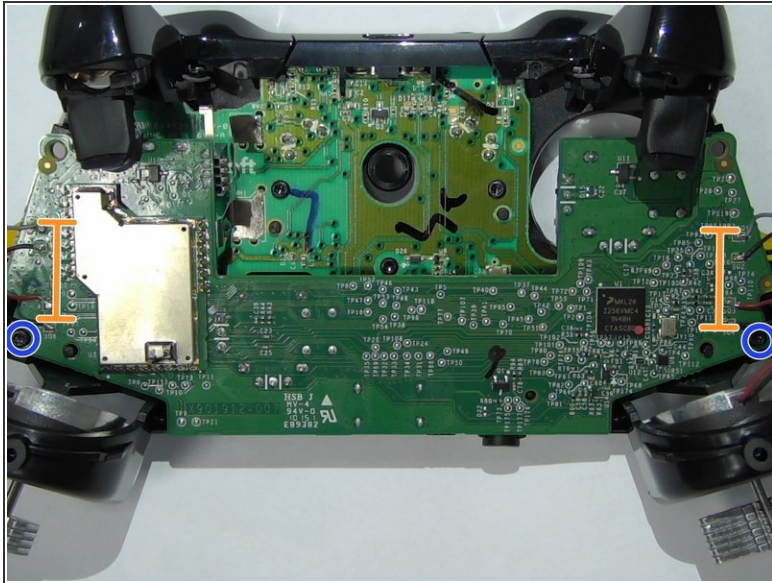
- Covert Forces model - Bowie 'Changes' look.
- New 3.5mm jack socket next to expansion port.

Step 2 — Remove plastics



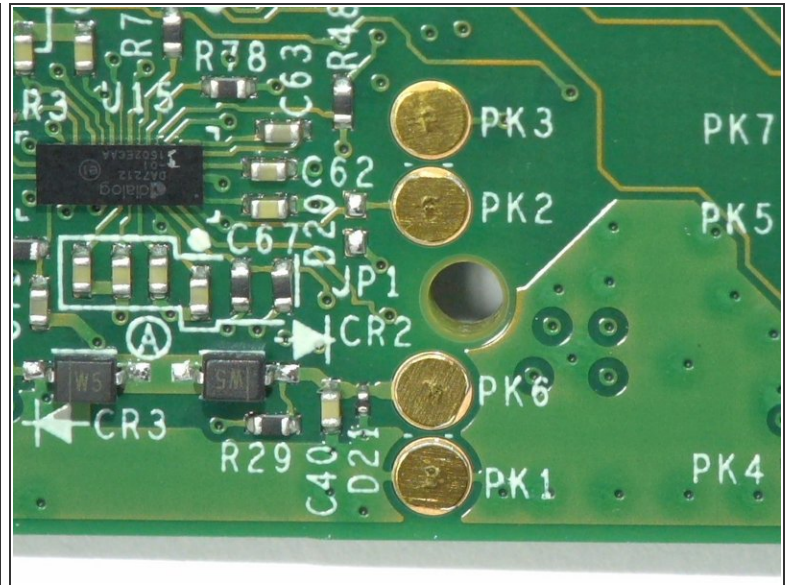
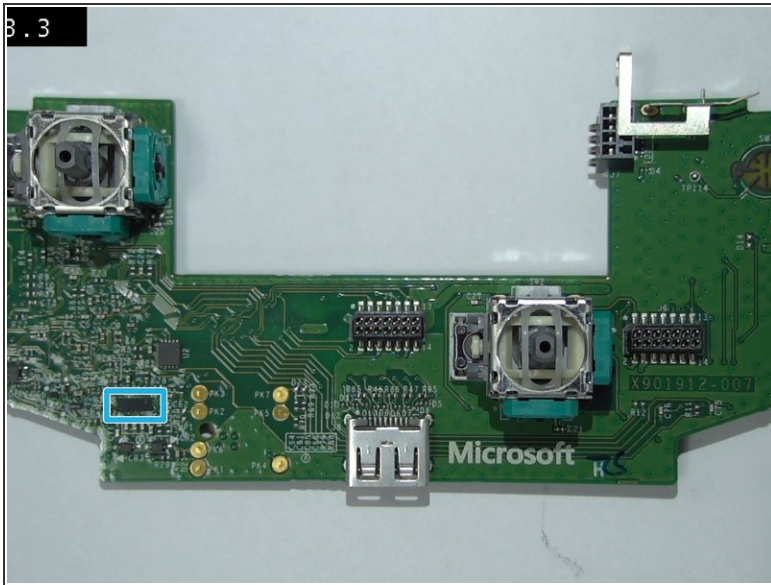
- Remove battery cover and battery
- Remove side panels using spudger
- Expose T9 security screw under label
- Remove 5 x T9 security screws from chassis
- Remove top and bottom covers

Step 3 — Seperate PCB's



- Remove 2 x T6 security screws on bottom PCB
- De-solder rumble pack and trigger wiring

Step 4 — CODEC and Jack Socket



- Thar she blows! [DA7212](#)
- [Dialog Semiconductor](#) CODEC with Class G HP AMP and Class AB speaker driver.
- CODEC sits next to contact pads for 3.5mm jack socket
