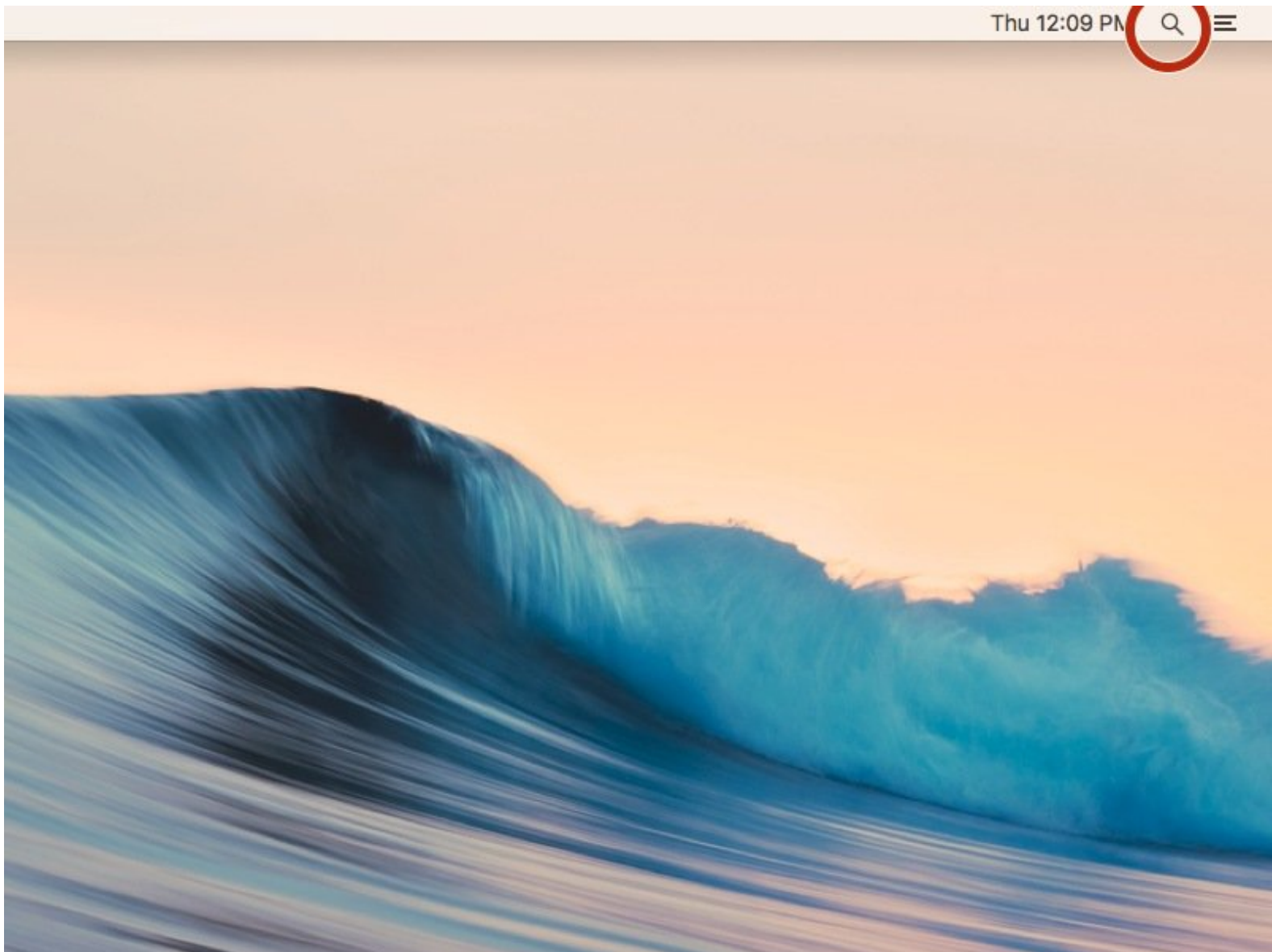




How to Run First Aid with Disk Utility

This guide will take you through running First Aid on the internal drive for Mac OS X El Capitan.

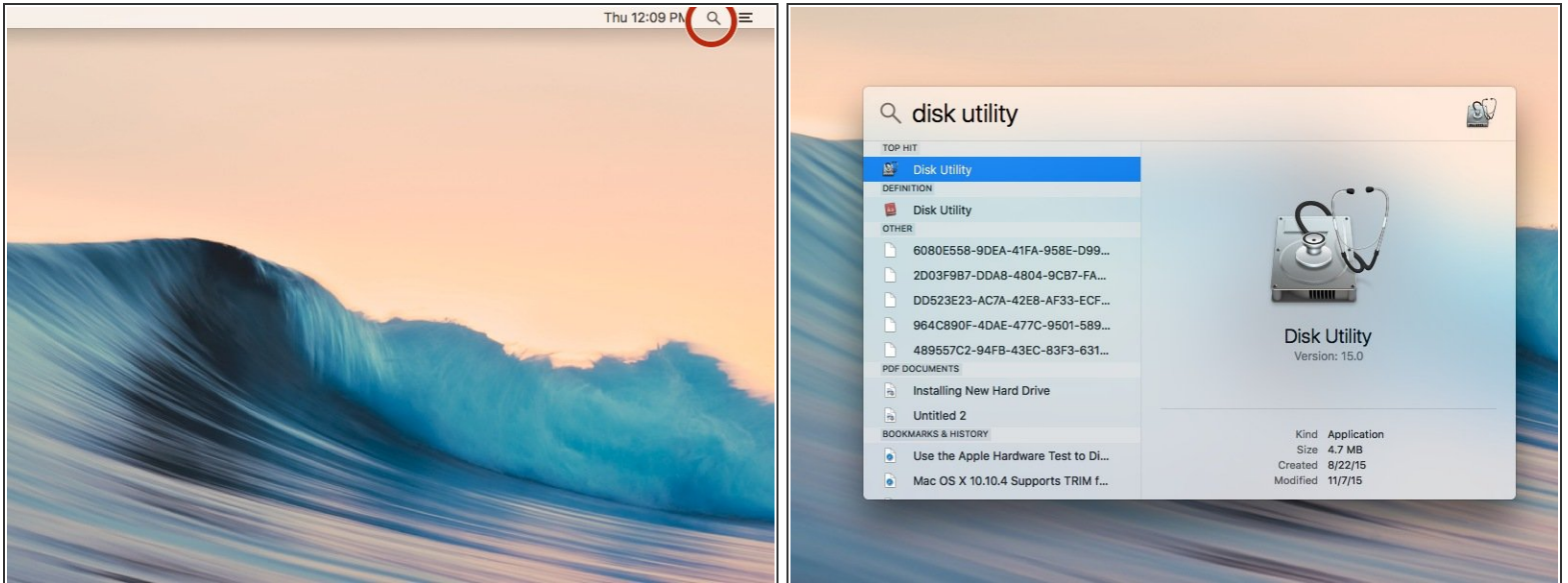

INTRODUCTION

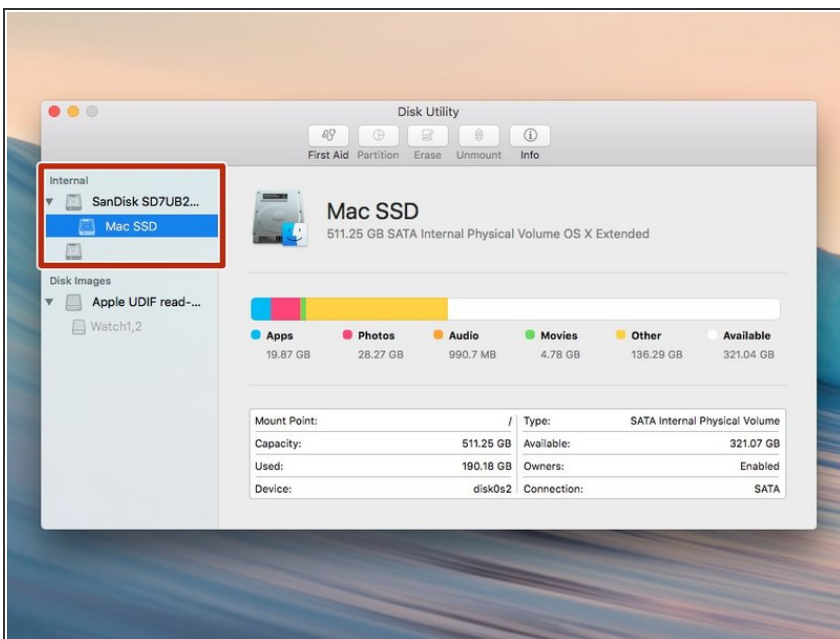
First Aid is a great tool for helping fix various issues relating to replacing parts on a Mac.

Step 1 — How to Run First Aid with Disk Utility



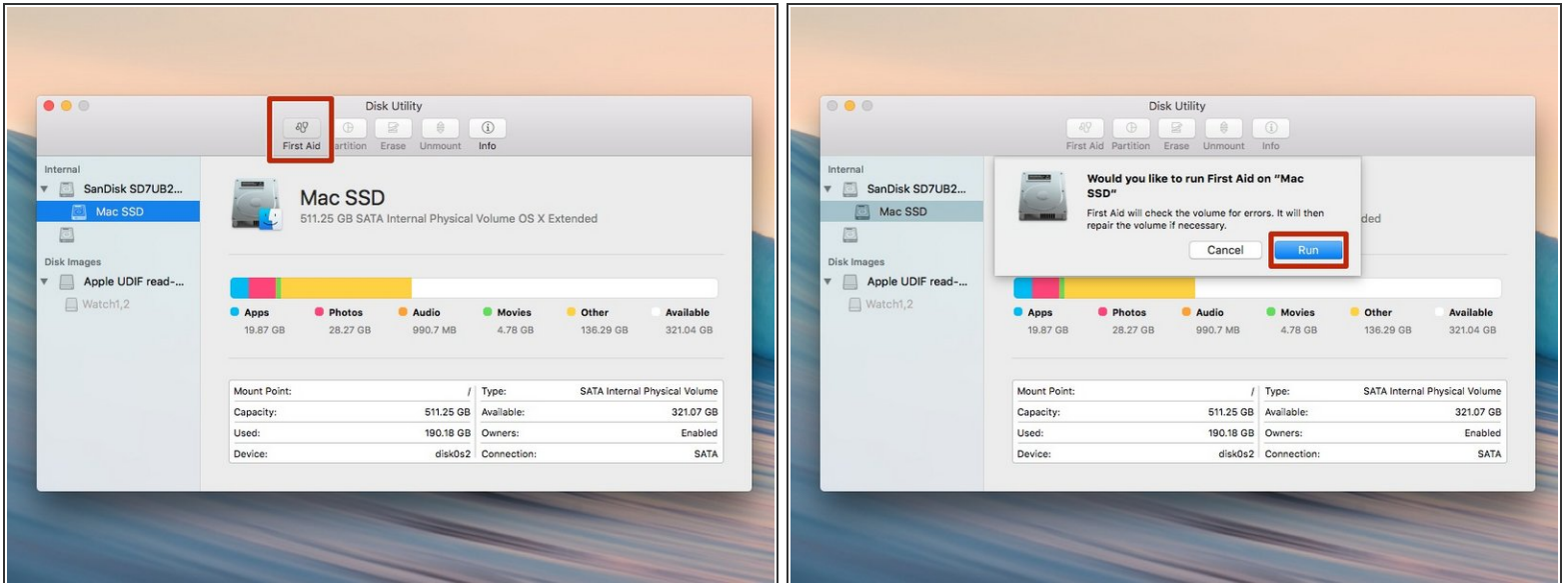
- Open Disk Utilities, which can be found in the Applications folder under Utilities
- **Pro Tip:** Take the shortcut and use Spotlight. *(This method is used in this guide)*

Step 2



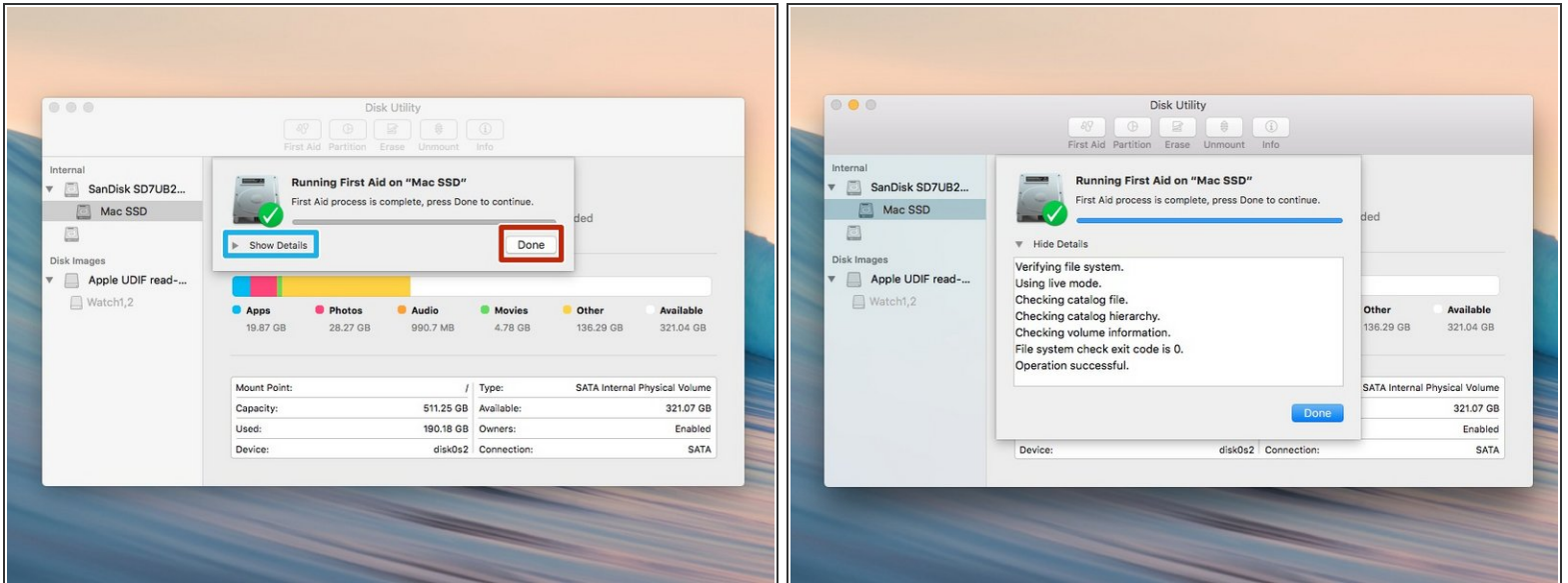
- Once opened, a window will appear like in the picture.
- Select the name of your Mac OS X Startup disk in the left column.


Step 3



- Click on the First Aid button at the top of the window.
- A dialogue box will appear asking if you would like to run First Aid.
 - Click "Run".

Step 4



- This procedure will take a few minutes to complete. The machine may freeze up, or lock up during this procedure.
-  Patience is key here.
- Once completed, click done.
 - **Pro Tip:** To see any errors that First Aid found, click on the arrow next to 'Show Details'.

Close Disk Utility, and the internal drive should be ready to go.
